Decorated Eggs Gum Ball Machine Egg



Items needed (quantity per creation)

• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- Acrylic paint
- Pen cap or small piece of dowel
- Medium size paintbrush
- About quarter of an A4 sheet of card or foam paper
- Hot glue (or PVA)

Instructions

- 1- Paint your egg white then set it aside to dry.
- 2- Once dry use your pen lid or dowel to make small circles on the bottom half of the egg. It is easier to do one layer with none of the dots touching, let it dry then do another to fill in the dots (acrylic paint is usually quite fast drying but if you need to speed up the process use a hair dryer).
- 3- Cut a strip of card approximately $2-3\,\mathrm{cm}$ high and $5-10\,\mathrm{cm}$ wide and a circle about the size of a 20 cent piece. Then glue the circle on the top of the egg like a lid and roll the strip into a cylinder shape and attach to the base of the egg like the stand. Add a small white square with a smaller black square below to look like the mechanism.

Decorated Eggs Scuba Egg



Items needed (quantity per creation)

• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- White and black acrylic paint
- Small and medium paintbrushes
- 1 bendy straw
- Hot glue


Optional

Permanent marker

Instructions

- 1- Start by painting your egg white, then leave to dry. Next paint the bottom half black and leave to dry.
- 2- Using the black make two small dot for eyes then add the goggle shapes around that. (For this part you could use a black permanent marker).
- 3- Next hot glue the straw so it sits along the half way line where the colours change and straight up beside the mask.

Minion Egg

Items needed (quantity per creation)

• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- Yellow, blue and black acrylic paint
- Small and medium paintbrushes
- 2 Googly eyes
- Hot glue


Optional

• Black permanent marker

Instructions

- 1- Start by painting your egg white, then leave to dry. Next paint the bottom half blue and leave to dry.
- 2- Next glue the two eyes on the yellow half of the egg.
- 3- Use a small paintbrush add the lines around the eyes and head to make the goggle shape and a small smile (for this part you could use a black permanent marker).

Decorated Eggs Sharpie Egg



Items needed (quantity per creation)

• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- Acrylic paint
- Sharpies (or permanent markers)

Instructions

- 1- Start by painting your egg gold (or any colour you wish), then leave to dry.
- 2- Use the sharpies to put a design over the gold, in this example one half was designed to look like Zebra stripes.
- 3- Once the first side is decorated then decorate the other side, this could be exactly the same or different. This example is leopard print but it could be stripes, dots or even words/ quotes.... the options are endless.







Decorated Eggs Emoji Egg



Items needed (quantity per creation)

• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- Yellow, red and black acrylic paint
- Small and medium sized brush


Optional

• Black and red permanent marker

Instructions

Emoji eggs can be heaps of fun, this example is only one of many emojis. Mr google will help you find images of the others so you can have a choice to work from.

- 1- Start by painting your egg yellow, then leave to dry.
- 2- Next use the small brush to make the mouth, which is a semi-circle painted with black
- 3- Add the heart eyes using the small brush (or permanent marker)

Decorated Eggs Speckled Egg



Items needed (quantity per creation)


• 1 egg

If real either blown or hard boiled or you can use a fake plastic/polystyrene egg

- Acrylic paint
- A medium size paintbrush

Instructions

- 1- Start by painting your egg a base colour (in this case blue), then leave to dry.
- 2- Put a small amount of paint on the brush and use it to stipple the egg. Stipple means small dots and is done by using your finger to flick the paint onto the egg.
- 3- Repeat step two as many times as you wish to get the effect you want.



Tip Eggs shapes can be hard to paint as they roll around a lot, use
