

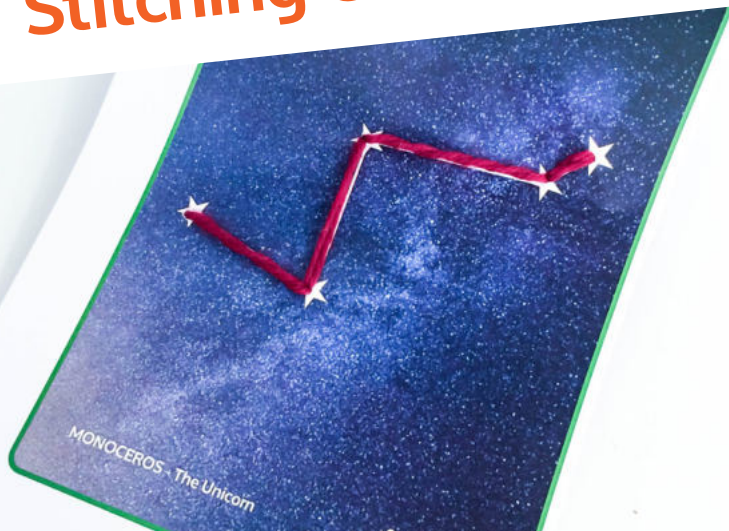
# Stitching Constellation

## Items needed (quantity per creation)

- Card
- Wool needle
- Wool

## Optional

- Needle threader



## Instructions

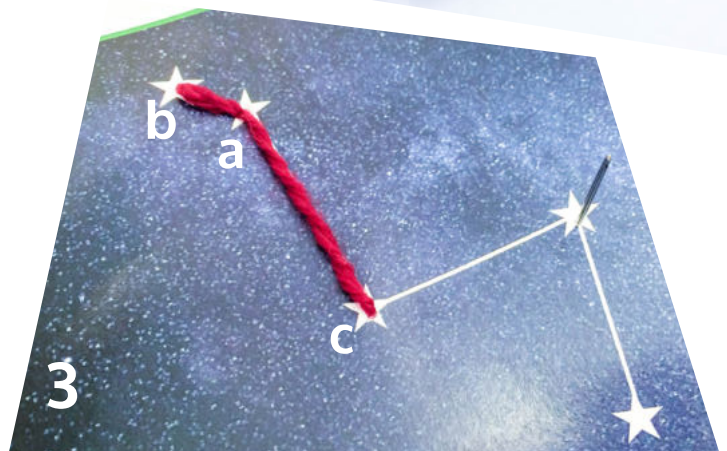
1- Print out your templates. The green templates are easier (better suited for younger children) and the orange ones are more detailed (better suited for higher ability children). You may want to pre-punch the holes for very young children

2- Give each child a length of wool, don't worry about how long just not too long that it will get tangled. Thread the needle and then tie the two ends together with a large knot so it won't pull through the card.

3- Simply stitch through each star, coming up in one star then back down through the next. If wanted back stitch could be used where you come up in one star (a) then go down into the previous one (b), then come back up on the next free one (c) and back down in the previous one (a). Carry on like this come up in 4 and down in 3... up in 5 down in 4...etc.

## Older children

The green templates may be a bit simple for the older children so give them the orange ones. You may want to suggest that if they have a constellation with an enclosed shape that they run the wool multiple directions between within the shape to fill it in and make it a solid colour

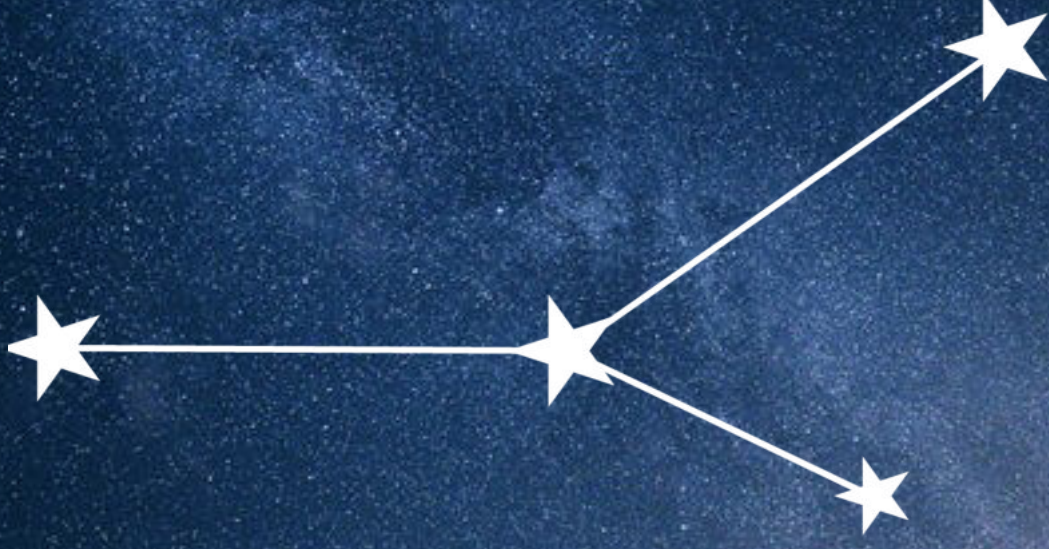




LUPUS - The Wolf

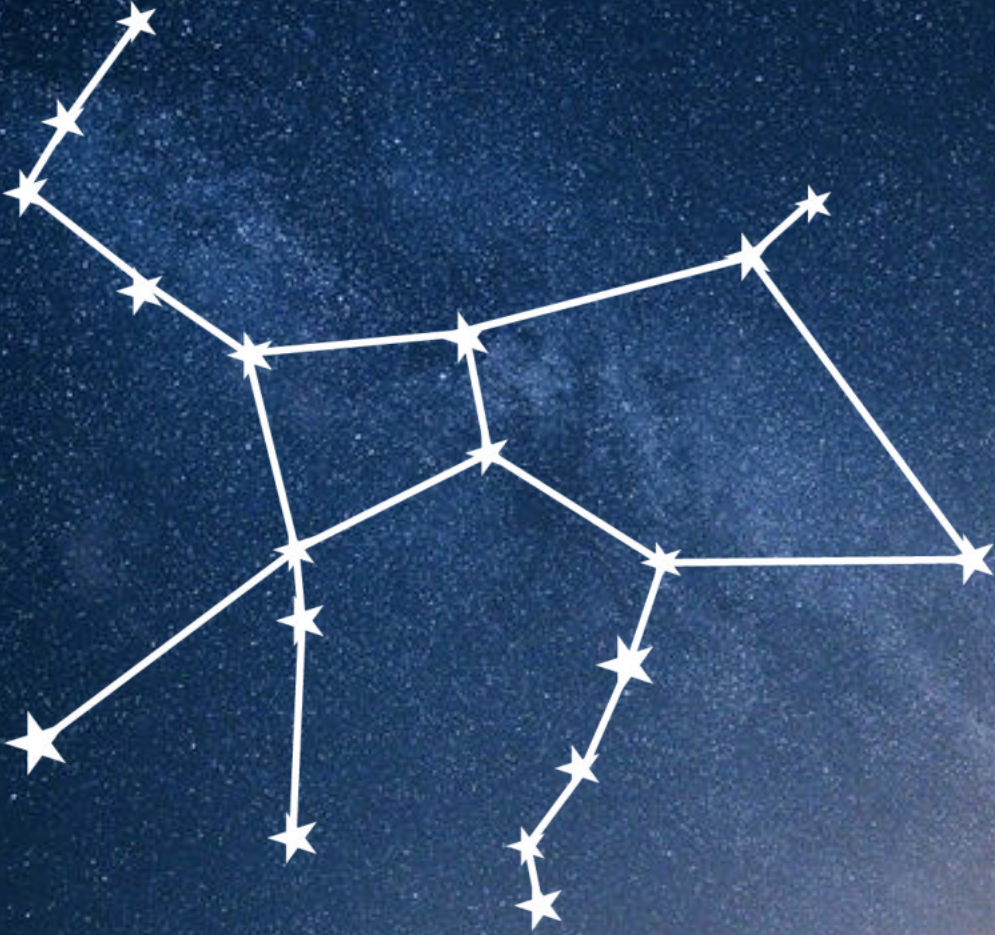
