

Melt and Pour Soap



Items needed (quantity per creation)

- Pot
- Metal Bowl
- Stirrer (Something like old chopsticks)
- Melt and pour soap (can be brought from online stores just google melt and pour soap. I use purenature.co.nz. The amount needed will depend on the mold sizes)
- Silicone molds (Candle and soap making supplies shops will have them or try Aliexpress.com)

Optional

- Soap colouring
- Soap additives
- Soap fragrance

Instructions

1- Fill your pot with boiling water and sit the bowl on top. Place on the element on medium heat. This is called a double boiler and is the safest way to melt the soap.

2- Add the melt and pour soap base into the bowl and melt until clear.

3- In your silicone mold, add any extras (fragrance, colour etc). Normally this would be done in the pot but this way you can make many different soaps in one batch. Slowly pour the liquefied soap in the molds and then set aside to cool.

Once cool remove from the molds.



This activity does involve hot liquids so remember to do your risk assessment before doing this activity.
