

Note: This template is best suited for younger ages.

- 1- Print off your template onto card (or trace onto card)
- 2- If you want to design your own flower this is the point to do so, as long as the black lines are kept you can change the yellow lines to create your own flower.
- 3- Next cut out pieces and colour in your pieces.

Paper Flowers (easier) cont.

4- Take the large arc piece and roll it till the end lines up with the dotted line printed in the middle and hot glue in place to create the pot.

5- Next take the part with the cut cross in it and lightly glue into the top of the pot.

6- Place both pieces of the flower together and slide on the leaves, as shown in the picture. Place the bottom of the flower on the cross in the pot. At this point you may wish to embellish your creation.

- One straw
- Hot glue



Note: This template is best suited for older ages.

- 1- Cut out all pieces.
- 2- Colour in the pot pieces if you wish.
- 3- Roll part C until the long end hits the dotted line.

Paper Flowers (harder) cont.

4- Take part A and put it in the top of the pot, glue the tabs down on the inside from the bottom of the pot.

- 5- Next glue in part B at the bottom of the pot just like part A.
- 6- Take parts D E and F and cut out as many tissue paper petals as you wish. We used three of each for this example.
- 7- Place petals together and pinch/twist the end.
- 8- Place the twisted flower end into the straw and add a little bit of hot glue to secure. Fan out your petals and place the straw in the hole on the top of the pot.
